Social Prescribing Day is about celebrating our community achievements and thanking all who help make them happen and this year it will be held from 2pm to 5.30pm on Thursday 14th March at the Health Hub, Chantry Centre (formerly the Vaccination Centre). The most exciting thing is that this year Andover & District Older People's Forum will have a stand at the Health Hub. We hope to be displaying all the things we have been doing and chatting to people about the Forum. So **do**, if you can make it, come along and support your Forum. TVBC are consulting on the draft Local Plan 2040 Regulation 18 Stage 2 between Tuesday 6 February and noon on Tuesday 2 April. The consultation is your chance to get involved in shaping the future of the Borough. The plan can be accessed online however there are also hard copies available at Beech Hurst and Former Magistrates Court in Romsey. Also at local Libraries including Andover, Romsey, North Baddesley, Lords Hill and Chandlers Ford.

AOPF will be submitting a response to this latest TVBC Local Plan consultation and will focus on housing for older and disabled people plus threats to the Iron Age Museum due to cuts in funding and how this will counter TVBC's focus on preserving our heritage.

Digital Skills for Health

The Social Prescribing Team at Andover PCN are working alongside Unity to provide support for those unable to access NHS services such as the NHS app or would like to build their confidence in accessing on their personal device(s).

The next Digital Skills session they are running is on the **25th March at King Arthur's Hall from 10am to 12pm.** This session is to provide information to those in the community about the NHS app including its benefits of use and to support individuals to download and access the app on their devices. All are welcome, even those without their own personal device.

Cat Lovers Countdown



Do you have a feline friend – or two? Did you know that as from 10th June all cat owners in England must ensure their furry companions are microchipped? This measure is aimed at making it easier for lost or strayed cats to be returned home which has got to be good news. If your cat is found without a microchip after that date you have a grace period of 21 days to have one implanted or risk a fine of up to £500. Microchipping is a one-time expense lasting the lifetime of your pet.

Update from the Force Crime Prevention Team



Hampshire and Isle of Wight Constabulary have recently issued a warning regarding **Sheep Worrying.** They tell us: - Sheep across the county will soon be bearing lambs and we are urging people to take care now to ensure they are not disturbing pregnant ewes. Whilst the majority of dog walkers are responsible, there are a minority who put the welfare of other animals at risk. When walking with your dog please keep these key points in mind to help with the welfare of sheep:

- Keep dogs on leads or under close control around livestock.
- If there is no livestock nearby, keep your dog in sight at all times and be confident it will return when called.
- It is a criminal offence for a dog to actively worry livestock and the owner can be prosecuted.



They also remind us of the **Blue Lamp Trust's Bobby Scheme.**

The Bobby Scheme is a free

service where trained police-vetted fitters will visit a home to carry out a full crime prevention and fire safety survey and fit items such as locks and smoke alarms.

It is free to those who are vulnerable due to age, circumstance, disabilities or a victim of a household crime. Anyone can make a referral, including individuals, friends, family and doctors.

Meals on Wheels

Health and Independent Living Support (HILS), now operates a meals-on-wheels delivery service across Hampshire.

- They operate from four sites across Hampshire (Winchester, Fareham, New Milton, Andover), six in Hertfordshire and two in West Sussex.
- They employ 430 team members, many facing barriers to employment
- They provide a range of services that support and promote independent living for older, disabled, and vulnerable people
- They support around 18,000 people each year

They deliver meals across Hampshire 365 days a year, all hot and fresh. We know it can be confusing for people to know what they are entitled to when it comes to meal delivery services, so we are hoping that at our next meeting (which is also our AGM) someone from HILS will be coming along to enlighten us and tell us all about the service.
