### May Council Elections





Are you registered to vote? Everyone has to be registered in order to vote. You can do this online by going to <a href="www.gov.uk/register-to-vote">www.gov.uk/register-to-vote</a> or if you don't have access to the internet Telephone 01264 368000.

**Voter ID.** You are now required to show photographic identification at polling stations before you are able to cast your vote.

Accepted forms of photo ID:

- Passport issued by the UK, any of the Channel Islands, the Isle of Man, a British Overseas Territory, an EEA state or a Commonwealth country
- Driving licence issued by the UK, any of the Channel Islands, the Isle of Man, or an EEA state (this includes a provisional driving licence)
- A Blue Badge
- Older Person's Bus Pass
- Disabled Person's Bus Pass
- Oyster 60+ Card
- Freedom Pass

If you don't have an accepted form or photo ID or you're not sure whether your photo ID still looks like you, you can apply for a free voter ID document, known as a Voter Authority Certificate.

Apply to vote by Post or Proxy. If you are unable to get to your polling station on Election Day, you can apply to vote by post or proxy if you do not already have these arrangements in place. You can apply online at <a href="https://www.gov.uk/apply-postal-vote">www.gov.uk/apply-postal-vote</a> or <a href="https://www.gov.uk/apply-proxy-vote">www.gov.uk/apply-proxy-vote</a>. If you are unable to apply online you can obtain a form in the post by phoning 01264 368000.

## Are you Vaccine Ready?



In Spring 2024, the Joint Committee on Vaccination and Immunisation (JCVI) advises that a **COVID-19 vaccine** should be offered to:

- adults aged 75 years and over. This includes those who turn 75 years old by 30 June 2024
- residents in a care home for older adults
- individuals aged 6 months and over who are immunosuppressed

This should be offered around 6 months after the last vaccine dose, although operational flexibility around the timing of the spring dose in relation to the last vaccine dose is considered appropriate (with a minimum interval of 3 months between doses) Visits to older adult care homes and eligible housebound patients should begin 15 April 2024. For all other eligible cohorts, vaccinations should start by 22 April 2024 and end on 30 June 2024.

# Women and Equalities Select Committee Inquiry

There was a special day in Andover on 18<sup>th</sup> March when a workshop was held on digital inclusion for Women and Equalities Select Committee Inquiry to which AOPF were invited to take part. Two MPs, one from Labour and one from the Conservative party were in attendance to hear the views of older people. Jenny Kay our Chairman, and Brian Kay attended together with many other older people's organisations both from Hampshire and beyond. Also National Pensioner Convention members were in attendance.

A wide ranging discussion took place highlighting the difficulties older people have if forced to order online food, tickets, make appointments or discuss medical issues. The closure of bank branches and the disappearance of counter service along with similar situations at Rail Stations and Car Parks was also fully debated

highlighting the absence of staff so valued by older people.

The question of an Older People's Champion was discussed and the need for a Commissioner for Older People in England.

Jenny was able to highlight the fact that medical appointments are sent online or via a text message not saying what the appointment is for. This is not helpful when one has more than one ailment (comorbidity).

Joanna Elson CBE of Independent Age has written to Jenny thanking her on behalf of Independent Age "for the articulate and persuasive way you told your story and those of your communities in Andover yesterday." I think we would all like to thank Jenny for representing our Forum and older people so well.
